

Parents of Students with Anaphylactic Allergies

TMS follows the following policy in regards to students who have anaphylactic allergies based on feedback from the experts at Anaphylaxis Canada:

- Students in the Toddler and Children's House Programs must provide the School with two EpiPens, clearly labeled with the student's name prior to **September 9, 2022**. One EpiPen will remain in the student's classroom and the other will be kept in the Main Office
- Students with anaphylactic allergies in the Elementary and Upper School are to wear their auto-injectors at all times. TMS will store a 2nd EpiPen in the Main Office
- As a parent of a child with life-threatening allergies, we need your cooperation in providing the School with current medical information and ensuring this policy is enforced

All parents of children with life-threatening allergies must:

- Complete the Anaphylaxis Emergency Plan form and attach a current picture of the student for the school records prior to **August 15, 2022**

Toddler and Children's House Parents must:

- Provide the School with two EpiPens as stated above

Elementary and Upper School Parents must:

- Provide the School with one EpiPen and ensure your child is wearing his/her other auto injectors (EpiPen)
